

Postdoctoral / Visiting Scientist Opportunity

A postdoctoral or Visiting Scientist opportunity is available within the research program on occupational cancers of IARC's Section of Environment and Radiation, headed by Dr Joachim Schüz. Within the Childhood Leukemia International Consortium (CLIC), the incumbent would contribute to the research program by conducting a pooled analysis of case-control studies on parental exposure to electromagnetic fields and the risk of childhood leukemia in the offspring. Part of the role also includes assisting scientists in building up their research agendas and project proposals for occupational epidemiology studies in several countries, namely the Russian Federation, Nigeria and Iran. The position is initially for a period of 12 months with the aim to launch activities in the countries mentioned above depending on successful fundraising. The researcher will be based in Lyon, France, but there will be opportunities for visits to selected research settings. The successful candidate would ideally have:

- PhD in epidemiology, medical statistics or public health
- Considerable experience in epidemiological fieldwork
- Strong methodological background
- Fluency in English

The current IARC postdoctoral / Visiting Scientist stipend is Euro 2750 per month. The cost of travel for the selected candidate, and in certain circumstances for dependants, will be met, a dependant's allowance paid, and health insurance covered.
